

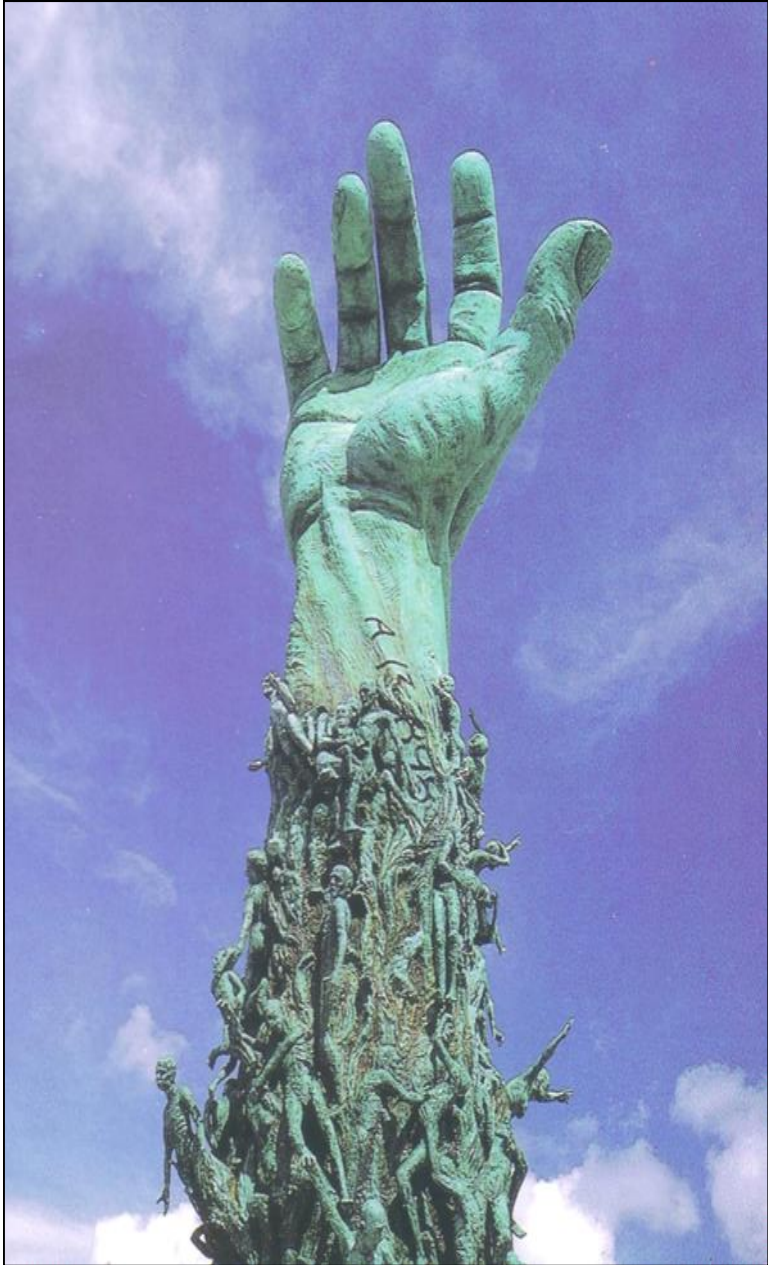

*Your life has ended, but your light can never be extinguished.

*I light this candle in your honor and in your memory. May
G-d bless you as you have blessed me with love, with grace
and with peace. Amen.*

A personal meditation

MOURNER'S KADDISH

How to Plan a Visit to a Cemetery

The purpose of a visit to a cemetery is twofold. The first reason is to remember the life of someone who we loved and inspired us. Visiting the place where they are buried provides us a place and a time to reflect on the meaning of their lives. The second dimension is often overlooked. Going to a cemetery is intended to remind us of our own mortality. We are meant to reflect upon the passage of time and ask ourselves if we are living a life of value and meaning to the fullest extent. Jewish prayers therefore reflect both of these aspects.

It is better to go to a house of mourning than to go to a house of feasting, for death is the destiny of everyone; the living should take this to heart. —

In the following pages, we will suggest ways you can frame your own visit, either alone or with family or friends. You may choose to use some of these materials for an unveiling as well. The materials are both traditional as well as contemporary, and we encourage you to choose that which you feel speaks to you.

Here is a suggested structure. You may adapt it according to your needs:

- 1) Introductory prayer
- 2) Suggested Psalms and meditations
- 3) Words about the deceased
- 4) Lighting yahrzeit Candle
- 5) Recitation of El Maleh Rachamim
- 6) Prayer upon leaving cemetery
- 7) Giving Tzedakah

Departing Cemetery

As one leaves the cemetery, it is customary to place a stone on the grave. This demonstrates the fact that the person has been visited. As ancient graves were often simply piles of stones, to place a stone is to tend to the gravesite.

Another interesting custom practiced by some is to detach some grass and throw it behind one's back, saying "Remember God, we are but dust of the earth."
